"Johnny" John David Kim is Strategic Engagement Director and Head of North East Asia at the GSMA. At PMG (now Globaldata plc), as Regional Managing Director for North East Asia, Johnny was responsible for all research and consulting businesses across key industry verticals.

Emanuela Lecchi is the Head of Public Policy for APAC at the GSMA, having previously worked in the organisation's London headquarters as Head of Competition. Jade served as Senior Advisor for Internet Policy at the National Telecommunications and Information Administration/U.S. Department of Commerce, Jade co-chaired a working group responsible for developing and coordinating U.S. government policy on international commercial data privacy. She also participated in the U.S.-EU Safe Harbor consultation initiated in 2013, Jade previously served as Director of Internet Public Policy at the State Department and as head of the U.S. delegation to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development's working party on information security and privacy. She also served as alternate head of delegation at various meetings of the OECD and International Telecommunication Union in Geneva, Jade has a bachelor of arts degree in history, with honors, from The George Washington University, and a juris doctor degree and certificate in international and comparative law from The Catholic University of America, Columbus School of Law.
